



Online submissions and paper surveys are due by Monday, April 1, 2019.

When offering feedback on the Interim Mass Schedule, please keep in mind the original criteria that continues to guide the Mass schedule. When determining mass schedules 50% of the church capacity is to be used. Also, the number of Masses per grouping is determined by the number of priests assigned by Bishop Zubik to active ministry in the grouping. Each priest assigned to the grouping is permitted to say a maximum of three Masses per weekend. Retired, resident or student priests living in a grouping are not to be included in the total number of weekend Masses.

We are now in the process of gathering courteous comments and responses with regard to changes, if necessary, to the interim mass schedule.

Please understand that any changes that may take place will comprise the final mass schedule that will be in use until a new parish is established.


